Module-A (Year 4 and graduate Course face to face teaching)

- To recognise that nutrition forms an important part of a Doctor's responsibilities

- To develop basic knowledge and skills on core principles of 'Food, Fluid and Nutritional Care' in hospital, especially (but not limited to);
 - o Screening, assessment and nutritional deficiencies (including micronutrients) o Hydration, fluids and electrolytes (including primary and secondary care)
 - o Under-nutrition and its acute clinical consequences (including intestinal failure)
 - o Obesity in the hospital setting (including bariatric medicine)
